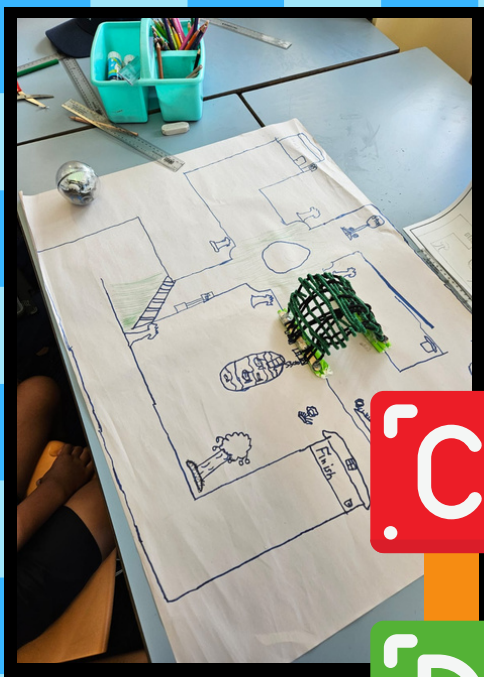
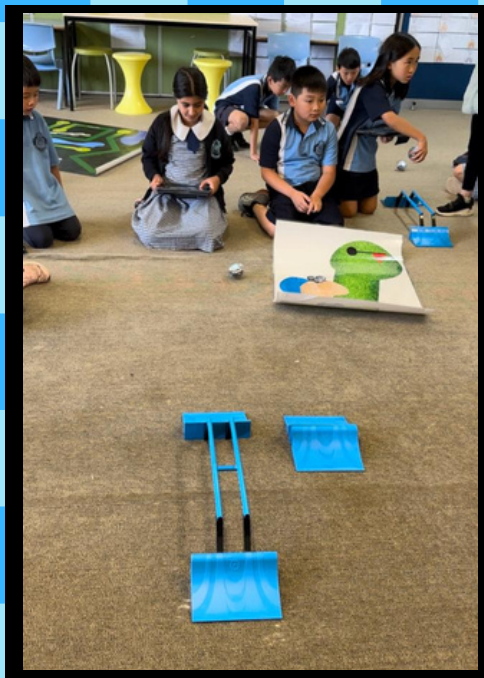
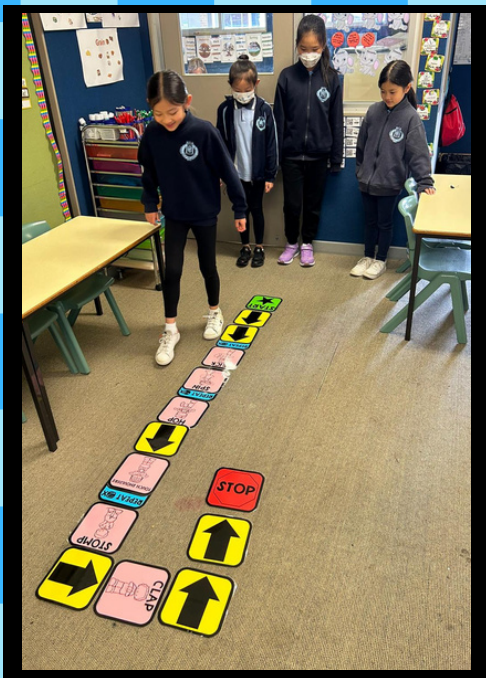
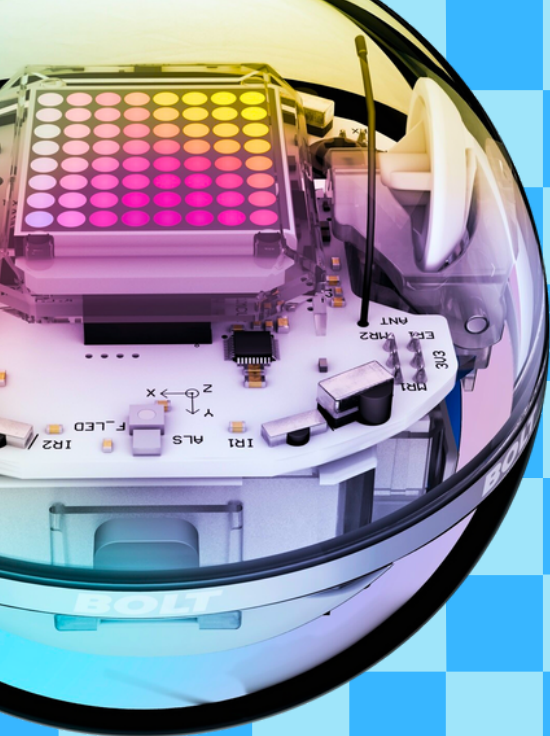
## STEMDAYS
